<b>Objectives</b>	<p>On completion of this course learners will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Understand the typical roles and responsibilities of the LTMO</li> <li>• Be able to plan relaxation lane closures</li> <li>• Gain an increased awareness of road works signage</li> <li>• Be aware of the Ch8 requirements for standard works and where relaxations can be applied</li> <li>• Be aware of industry safe working practices</li> </ul>
<b>Target audience</b>	All persons who will be required by their employer to work on motorways and or high speed dual carriageways as a lead traffic management operative, on standard works schemes where temporary road markings <b>ARE NOT</b> required, and all works with relaxations.
<b>Pre-requisites</b>	Learners must either be registered with Lantra Awards as a Temporary Traffic Management Operative or as a minimum they must have sat the one day 12A / B Operative course and have started their logbook of assessments. The registration as an LTMO will only become effective provided the logbook of assessments has been completed AND the one day Operative course certificate is still valid.
